Screening protocols should be continued for healthcare workers, patients and any visitors.


Proper Hand Hygiene will be the first defense in limiting cyclical occurrences of COVID-19.


Your center will need to replenish the PPE supply and be sure there is enough for proper handling of patients and procedures.
